Dental Crowns: Types, Benefits and Longevity

A dental crown is a protective "cap" that restores the shape, strength and appearance of a tooth. Crowns are commonly recommended for teeth with large fillings, cracks, heavy wear, or after root canal treatment.

Crown options

Туре	Best for	Benefits	Considerations	Typical longevity*
Ceramic (tooth- coloured)	Front or back teeth where appearance matters	Highly aesthetic; natural-looking	May chip under heavy clenching/grinding; may require a night guard	Often 10 – 15+ years
Metal- ceramic (porcelain on metal)	Back teeth; where strength and tooth colour are both needed	Strong and durable; tooth- coloured	Can be slightly less lifelike than all-ceramic; may show a darker margin at the gum in some cases	
Gold	Molars; cracked teeth; heavy bite forces; grinders	Very strong; kind to opposing teeth; can be made thin (may preserve tooth structure)	Not tooth-coloured (visible)	Often 15– 20+ years

^{*}Longevity varies with oral hygiene, bite forces, diet, and regular maintenance.

What affects how long a crown lasts?

- **Gum and tooth health at the crown edge** (the crown cannot decay, but the tooth underneath can).
- Clenching/grinding (a night guard may be advised).
- Regular check-ups and hygiene maintenance.
